Though washers look like the biggest winner in Q1 of 2015, in Q1 of 2016, and totaled over \$7,000 of washers, but this year that number grew over 2,000 percent with a value of \$169,000!

The United States' trade relationship with Turkey has remained strong over the last few years. In 2014, total U.S. imports from Turkey reached \$7.3 billion and total exports were over \$11.6 billion. The fastener trade between the two nations only makes up about 0.1 percent of that, but continues to grow every year. From 2013 to 2014, U.S. imports of fasteners from Turkey grew 4 percent and totaled \$5.8 million. U.S. exports of fasteners to Turkey grew a huge 42 percent from 2013 to 2014 and totaled \$11.3 million.

Total Fastener Imports (Q1 2015)

So far in Q1 of 2015, fastener imports from Turkey are still climbing. Compared with Q1 of 2014, the United States has imported 9 percent more fasteners in Q1 of 2015, which is a value shift from \$1.3 million to \$1.5 million. If this pattern continues, it looks like U.S. import of fasteners in 2015 will increase a much larger percentage than last year.

Imported Fastener Products from Turkey

In Q1 of 2015, the United States imported 26 different varieties, by HTS code, of fasteners from Turkey. The top three so far this year are non-threaded fasteners (HTS 7318.29.0000), wood screws (HTS 7318.12.0000), and washers (HTS 7318.22.0000). Non-threaded fastener imports grew a


Top Ports of Import

It's probably not surprising that most U.S. fastener imports from Turkey arrive on the East Coast. The top three ports of entry are the port of Newark, NJ, Savannah, GA, and Dallas-Fort Worth, TX. The port of Newark imports the largest share of Turkish fasteners and with 19 percent of the total in Q1 of 2015. Savannah imported another 14 percent of the imports and Dallas-Fort Worth another 11 percent.

Total Fastener Exports

It's not often that the United States actually exports more of something than it imports, but the fastener trade with Turkey happens to be the case. U.S. exports of fasteners to Turkey totaled nearly \$2.9 million in Q1 of 2015, about \$1.3 million higher than fastener imports from Turkey. This was an 8 percent increase from exports in Q1 of 2014.

Exported Fastener Products to Turkey

The top three fastener products exported to Turkey are bolts (HTS 7318.15.2000), nuts (HTS 7318.16.0000), and non-threaded fasteners (HTS 7318.29.0000). Interestingly, bolts make up a large bulk of the products exported. In fact in Q1 of 2015, bolts accounted for 41 percent of U.S. fastener exports to Turkey and totaled nearly \$1.2 million, which was a 5 percent increase from Q1 of 2014. Nuts make up about 17 percent of the exports and totaled \$512,000 in Q1 of 2015. Unfortunately, nut exports declined by 22 percent from Q1 of 2014. Non-threaded fasteners account for 12 percent of exports, totaled \$346,000, and grew about 3 percent from 2014.

Top Ports of Export

U.S. exports of fasteners to Turkey leave from both the East and West Coasts. The top port of export in Q1 of 2015 is Newark, NJ, followed by JFK International Airport. What's fascinating is that the third-largest port of export is LA International Airport. LA International handled about \$278,000 worth of fasteners in Q1 of 2015. It also used to be the leading port of export back in 2013. The reason for the decline in exports from LA could be due to the much further distance than East Coast ports and in the last few years it simply became too expensive, so supply chains shifted.

Recap of the U.S. Fastener Trade with Turkey

Overall, the fastener trade between the United States and Turkey remains strong. A 9 and 8 percent growth in imports and exports from last year, respectively, is a huge signal of that. Fastener imports are a great indicator for the state of an economy and the construction industry for a nation. The necessity for more fasteners to Turkey shows that Turkish infrastructure is flourishing. This year, Turkey may import more fasteners from the United States than ever before. Though, fasteners are a small piece of the total-trade pie between the nations, it is an extremely positive relationship.
